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# JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Minutes of the Meeting under s. 13.10

May 31, 2022

Co-Chair Marklein presided and called the meeting to order.

#### I. Department of Health Services

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the transfer of (a) \$3,724,400 GPR in each fiscal year from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's general program operations appropriation under s. 20.435(2)(a) to fund reestimated overtime costs at the state mental health institutes; (b) \$2,103,200 GPR in each fiscal year from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's secure mental health units or facilities appropriation under s. 20.435(2)(bm) to fund reestimated overtime costs at the secure treatment centers; and (c) \$2,635,000 PR in each fiscal year from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(g) to the department's institutional operations and charges appropriation under s. 20.435(2)(gk) to fund reestimated overtime costs at the state centers for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

## II. Office of the Commissioner of Insurance

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to increase the cap on the 2021 plan year reinsurance payments by \$5,000,000 from \$200,000,000 to \$205,000,000 as authorized under s. 601.83(1)(h).

#### III. Department of Justice

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the transfer of \$1,000,000 GPR in fiscal year 2021-22 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's community-oriented policing-house grant program appropriation under s. 20.455(2)(cp) in fiscal year 2022-23, to award grants to cities under the community-oriented policing-house grant program.

#### IV. Department of Justice

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the transfer of \$2,000,000 GPR in fiscal year 2021-22 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's school safety appropriation under s. 20.455(2)(f) in fiscal year 2022-23, to award grants to schools for critical incident mapping data.

#### V. Department of Justice

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the transfer of \$2,000,000 GPR in fiscal year 2021-22 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's grants for body cameras appropriation under s. 20.455(2)(d) in fiscal year 2022-23, to award grants to law enforcement agencies to purchase body cameras for law enforcement officers.

### VI. Department of Military Affairs

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Loudenbeck to approve the transfer of \$1,536,000 SEG in fiscal year 2021-22 and \$749,200 SEG in fiscal year 2022-23 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(u) to the department's state disaster assistance; petroleum inspection fund appropriation under s. 20.465(3)(s), on a one-time basis, to pay claims submitted by local units of government for damages and costs incurred as a result of a disaster.

#### VII. Department of Military Affairs

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Loudenbeck to approve the transfer of \$1,500,000 SEG in fiscal year 2022-23 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(u) to the department's Next Generation 911 appropriation under s. 20.465(3)(qm) to provide geographic information system grants. Additionally, it was approved to create 2.0 FTE SEG positions, including a GIS specialist and a grants specialist, in fiscal year 2022-23 for GIS program operations and grants administration. The positions must be funded using the department's base budget in the 2023-25 biennium.

#### VIII. Department of Military Affairs

Moved by Senator Ballweg and seconded by Representative Loudenbeck to approve the transfer of \$500,000 GPR in fiscal year 2021-22 from the Committee's appropriation under s. 20.865(4)(a) to the department's urban search and rescue task force appropriation under s. 20.465(3)(dv) to provide training and equipment for the urban search and rescue teams (Wisconsin Task Force 1).

#### IX. Department of Administration

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve, pursuant to s. 20.004(2), the updated summaries and schedules under ss. 20.005(1), (2)(a) and (b), and (3) prepared by the department and Legislative Fiscal Bureau, which include the fiscal effect of all legislation enacted by the 2021 Legislature.

Moved by Senator Marklein and seconded by Representative Born to approve the nine settlement agreements submitted by the department to the Joint Committee on Finance under s. 165.08. Pursuant to s. 165.10, and in light of the presumption embodied in s. 20.906(1), the Committee believes that the Attorney General must deposit all settlement funds, including attorneys' fees from settlements, into the general fund for general revenue purposes. However, in light of the recent decision in Wis. State Legislature v. Kaul, No. 2021-CV-152 (Wis. Cir. Ct. Polk Cnty.) on the meaning of s. 165.10, the Committee approves the proposed plans, notwithstanding the plans' failure to commit all attorneys' fees into the general fund for general revenue purposes. The Committee notes, however, that the decision in Wisconsin State Legislature v. Kaul on the meaning of s. 165.10 is currently on appeal. See Wis. State Legislature v. Kaul, No. 2022-AP-431 (Wis. Ct. App. notice of appeal filed March 14, 2022).
